Lifeguarding

Lifeguarding looked a little different this season. The loss of our club house was a huge blow and with our ATV also out of action for majority of the season it meant the season came with a number of challenges. I am extremely proud of how everyone rose to the challenge and made the most of a less than ideal situation. I want to give a massive thank you to Black Dog Consulting and Brian Perry Civil for the use of their containers, you were integral in keeping our lifeguard services running and kept our lifeguards dry on those not so pleasant days.

This season we had 14 new lifeguards join our team. A big welcome to our newest lifeguards Jamie, Zoe, Monique, Ana, Rebecca, Poppy-Mae, Anna, Milla-Rose, Ben and Dillion.



Our instructors did an outstanding job of ensuring trainings ran smoothly and candidates were prepared for their new role of surf lifeguard. A number of our instructors were also involved in mentoring and instructing at Intermediate Guard School and the National Lifeguard School showcasing the level of skill shown by our instructors. We are really lucky to have such a dedicated group of instructors within the club and this shows in the calibre of our newest lifeguards.

This year we had 56 refreshed and actively patrolling lifeguards which is a little down on previous seasons but not unexpected given our current circumstances. Together they completed a total of 1444.5 hours of patrolling as well as preforming 3 rescues on our home beach and a number of rescues, searches, assists and first aids both on our beach and beaches around the country. I'd like to thank everyone who wore the red and yellow uniform this season as well as the huge number of volunteers behind the scenes that keep our lifeguard services running smoothly.

On top of our regular volunteer and regional guard duties our lifeguards helped patrol a number of local and national events including the Wellington Ocean swim and the Kapiti Woman's Triathlon who we look forward to working with them again next season. A special shout out should also go to our event guard team. This team spent countless hours on the water ensuring the safety of our competing athletes. Their dedication not only ensures the smooth running of competitions, but they bring their skills and experience back to Paekākāriki.

A number of lifeguards worked to upskill throughout the season, gaining awards and experience in a range of areas and we are grateful for their dedication to improving their lifeguard skills. Special mentions to Ben Norris who attend Intermediate Lifeguard School and Brianna was chosen to mentor at this years Advanced Guard School. Together our IRB instructors Ben and Riley qualified three new crewmen and four IRB drivers with a number of guards just waiting for the right conditions to finish off their assessments. It was awesome to see the supportive and welcoming environment that the boys have created at their trainings and I'm excited to see this continue to grow next season.

As the season draws to an end so too does my time as Director of Lifeguarding. It's been an epic adventure the past 5 years and I feel privileged to have had the opportunity to lead such an awesome team of lifeguards. There are some challenging and very exciting times ahead with the new clubhouse on the horizon and I'm excited for our team to gain a new Director of lifeguarding with a fresh perspective to lead us into this new chapter.

Surf Boats



With another covid season been and gone, it would be easy to just write the season off as another lost year, but there have been a few gems to take out of it, so read on for what our boaties got up to this season.

As a general rule of thumb, we kick our training off around June/July. However, after a post (canceled) nationals meeting the decision was made to take a crew to the George Bass surfboat marathon in Australia. A bold call at the time, but with Covid appearing to be settling down, we thought (wrongly) that it would be worth a crack.

With that, 10 girls were back in the boat in April, with an eye to the big race in Jan 2022. Around 3 months (and a lot of ergs/gym sessions and cold dark rows) later, at the end of July. We had the decision taken out of our hands, as the race organisers canceled the event as covid raged through Australia and made it impossible for them to plan the event. Gutting for the girls, but the upside being the girls were in great physical condition as we then reset and began working towards the season.

Around July, we then brought rowers who had not done the winter training back into the schedule, and began setting crews up for the year ahead. After a few false starts, we finally settled into 6 full time crews, and a couple of casual crews. 2 x open woman (Mum's and Tumbleweeds), 2 x U 19 woman (Dark Side and Cruise Control), 1 x U 23 woman (Pink Ladies), 1 x U 23 men (Showtime).

Another blow to the section, was a change of training base due to our boats beginning to get vandalised and gear being stolen out of them where we normally store them at Mana. So, we made the call to move to the more exposed, but secure area by the Mana Sea Scouts. From here, we settled into the usual routines of 5am or 6pm trainings, and after the generous offer from Porirua Rowing club, the option of early morning trainings in their erg room in Titahi Bay.

From here, our crews did a great job of rolling with the covid punches as change after change came with events being moved or canceled. Where possible we made every effort to attend events locally, regionally and nationally.

A reflection of that extra work that our girls had done over winter showed in their standings in the national boat series. The Mum's and Tumbleweeds were sitting $1^{st}/2^{nd}$ respectively, U19's Dark Side, 2^{nd} as we moved to the final event of the series. Unfortunately, again covid caused a cancellation and with that, disbanding of the national series leaving our girls without some much-deserved results.

On the back of all these disruptions, our section had some great trips away to centrals (Waimarama). The canceled North Island champs in Waihi (training/team build weekend in some big surf). Then finishing with another trip back to Waihi (more big surf) for a reduced North Islands after the cancellation of nationals. A fun and exciting end to a frustrating season. Our crews all performed well in some perfect 2m plus surf under blue sunny skies. This was probably the saving grace for our boaties as we got to finish the year on an enjoyable and positive note.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank some people who made big contributions to our section this year.
