Chair's report

What a year the 23-24 year has been! It has been an exciting year for the club with so much going on across every spectrum of the club. For me it has been wonderful to see the positive spirit across the club and the way our membership has conducted itself without the resources of most clubs.

Once again, the club operated from containers and the membership stepped up to make the season happen. All of the day-to-day challenges were met while the club has been taking on the biggest project we have ever embarked upon. This past year our members delivered a safe beach, great sports programmes and a well-functioning club.

I must thank all of the coaches, managers, parents and helpers that made the junior surf programme a stunning success. Even though we don't have the facilities the programme ran well, the numbers increased and we had an increase in young athletes attending the local and national carnivals. Massive thanks to Henry and his team of helpers for the leadership of the nipper programme.

Our senior surf boat and craft programmes have also grown this year under the leadership of Dave, Rado and Steve. The club had great results across all competitions and the finale was the large team travelling to the Mount for Nationals, not only picking up a handful of medals but also many athletes making it to finals and semifinals. This is great testament to our coaching programmes and the support from the parents, as well as the positive attitude of our athletes.

I must also thank our volunteer officials and water safety crews in which Paekākāriki is well represented and highly regarded. Our club officials and water safety guards collectively did 758 hours officiating on the beaches around the country this season.



Our lifeguarding programme was very successful and our patrols kept the public safe at both Paekākāriki beach and beyond, with our guards doing 1785 hours of patrol. We also saw many of our guards upskilling which has given us some of the most skilled patrols in the region. We had 12 new lifeguards qualify and 8 IRB awards (crew and driver) gained. We also had 81 surf lifeguards refresh this year.

This is not something that just happens, it takes a lot of work from many people and this year was no different. We had great instructors leading our lifeguard award and

IRB programmes, and very motivated and skilled patrol captains. Thanks to Ben Strombom for taking the reins as lifeguard director and leading this big portfolio for the club.

The new build programme has taken a lot of time for many members of the club and the committee. It has been in the making for over 10 years and it is great to have the construction programme finally underway. Thanks to all involved in getting this across the start line.



I have to say a massive thanks to the committee for all of their work this year. It has been an extreme year for the club and the committee has put in an incredible amount of work to keep the waka moving forward in the right direction. Thank you all, it has been a joy working with you all.

Our members, parents and supporters have been so positive and resilient and I look forward to seeing the progress of the club next year and the strength of our membership grow. Lifeguarding

Another great season lifeguarding at Paekākāriki. Like last season, we do not have a club building meaning we were patrolling out of containers again. This proves to be very challenging at times but I would like to give a massive thank you to all of our patrolling members for their positive attitude and adaptability to the situation we are faced with.

I want to give a massive thank you to Black Dog Consulting for the use of their container once again. You were integral in keeping our lifeguard services running and kept our lifeguards dry on those not so pleasant days, we thank you for everything you have done and continue to do to support our lifeguards. A big thank you also to our patrol captains for ensuring all patrols ran smoothly. A special mention to Mike Ward for assuring our ATV was up to date on maintenance and always operational. Another special mention to Caylee Cooke, Ally Jones and Monique Lepionka for taking the reins of lifeguard instructing for our new lifeguard candidates, as well as all of the other instructors for giving up your time to instruct.

This season we had 12 new lifeguards join our team. A big welcome to our newest lifeguards Emma Norris, Hamish Allan, Lola Cowley, Elsa Kelly, Jordan Ward, Luke Martin, Joe Reiher, Nala Trist, Lucy Campbell, Felix Thomas, Nikau Gibson, and Henry Curtis - you all did a fantastic job in your lifeguard exam. Our instructors did an outstanding job of ensuring trainings ran smoothly and candidates were prepared for their new role. A number of our instructors were also involved in mentoring and instructing at Intermediate Guard School showcasing the level of skill shown by our instructors. We are really lucky to have such a dedicated group of instructors within the club and this shows in the caliber of our newest lifeguards.

This year we had 80 refreshed and actively patrolling lifeguards. Together they completed a total of 1,785 hours of patrolling as well as 214 preventative actions, 3596 safety interventions, and performing 16 minor first aids on our home beach with many more completed by our lifeguards at beaches around the country.

On top of our regular volunteer and regional guard duties, our lifeguards once again helped patrol a number of local and national events including the XTERRA triathlon and the Kapiti Women's Triathlon, we look forward to working with them again next season. A special shout out should also go to our event guard team. This team spent countless hours on the water ensuring the safety of our competing athletes. Their dedication not only ensures the smooth running of competitions, but they bring their skills and experience back to Paekākāriki.

A number of lifeguards worked to upskill throughout the season, gaining awards and experience in a range of areas and we are grateful for their dedication to improving their lifeguard skills. Special mention to Hatti Jones and Savanna Ward who attended Intermediate Lifeguard School.



Together our IRB instructors Amy, Ben, Dwight and Riley continued to upskill our up-and-coming IRB drivers and crewman and are looking to start training back up at the end of June. It was awesome to see the supportive and welcoming environment that the boys have created at their trainings and I'm excited to see this continue to grow in the coming months.

As the season draws to an end, we look forward to the coming one and the exciting things it will bring in the lifeguard space. With the construction of our new club house underway, hopefully we will not be in containers next season. As mentioned above, thanks again to all of the lifeguards who gave up their time to keep the beach safe.

Surf Sport

Seniors

Last season we saw some growth in the numbers in the Craft group and leading up to winter training I was aware of quite a lot of interest from potential new members - but you don't count your chickens until you see them lined up ready to go in the cold and the dark at the first winter training. Sure enough, there they were and for the second year in a row, despite having no clubhouse, our numbers increased.

Winter trainings regularly saw around 10 people attending which was great and as usual at this time of year, despite the cold, the weather was pretty good to us. In fact, I think across the entire season we only cancelled two trainings.



Winter training was only possible thanks to the Chamberlains storing the trailer at their place and Dunc and Mike Bennett organising getting the trailer to every session. Dunc and Mike also towed the trailer to some of the major events and were the Mr Fixits when it came to taking care of all those little things which allow us to function. Thanks guys.

As usual for the new guys, those who made it to winter training and got the early sessions in on the Ski on the harbour developed well throughout the season where as those that don't turn up until later struggle to master the Ski for the rest of the season.

A number of our new members had a swimming background and as a result we did a couple of Surf Sport Pool training sessions and then had good numbers at both the Wellington and Central region Pool champs where we had great results, including dominating the Open Men's and Women's divisions.

A good attendance at the Surf sport swimming events helped to develop a good culture within the team which continued throughout the whole season. Once daylight saving came and we were back at the beach we got to put the gear back in the containers, but still had no changing sheds and no showers. Despite this we continued to get good numbers at training and a positive attitude from all.

I was a little concerned heading back to the beach as there had been forecasts of an extremely strong El Nino weather system which would normally mean a lot of North West storm surf, however these winds never really eventuated and when they did, we seemed to be lucky enough to train during wind directions changes.

This season I tried to remain a little more flexible as far as changing our training location to suit weather or whatever beach condition we needed. This saw us chucking the gear back on the trailer when serious southerlies hit and taking it to Pukerua bay where the southerly whisked overhead and instead of a soul-destroying chop, we had flat, comfortable and calm conditions. As it turned out Nationals were flat and calm so we got some great speed work in these sessions which, mirrored the conditions we would later have to compete in. Pukerua Bay also has the perfect water's edge to practice the ski carry dry start which most people were predicting we would have at Nationals (but never eventuated).

Thanks to Matt Warren for taking training over the Christmas Hols period. I heard that my return was welcome as the sessions had been a bit hard! Also, thanks to Seth Forbes who covered my inadequacies by taking some beachy event training between October and Nationals.

We did the same local and major comps as usual and the team continued to perform well. It was good to see us line up with two Open Surf race teams at both ERC's and Nationals. The Surf teams performed well with the Open Men's 'A' team getting a bronze at ERC's and a 5th at Nationals.

Mike and Dunc erected a container shelter between two of the containers in early February to give us some cover when required. Three days after they put it up, we had storm force northerlies immediately followed by storm force southerlies, however their work stood up to the test and it remained solid.

After ERC's we upped the usual 3 trainings per week to 5 training sessions per week, with a Saturday morning Surf Swim session at Plimmerton. Plimmerton has great beach conditions for practicing wading and porpoising.

Nationals was a great competition for us and everyone performed well. An 18-athlete team competed. The culture that had built up during the year was obvious when a lot of our best results were from team events. Between Tube and Board rescue we made 5 finals with a couple of near misses and Alex Cecioni and Max Jones combined to take a bronze medal in the Open Board Rescue. This is a medal two years running for Alex and our first open medal for several years.

Thanks to all those that backed me up throughout the season, particularly Teri Anderson for looking after entries. To all our Officials who officiate around the country and allow our team to enter other people's events, I thank you.

Surf Boats

Another good year has passed for our boat section. Once again, we had good crew numbers with 3 open women's crews, 1 U 23 women, 1 U 23 men, 1 U 19 women and 1 masters men. 7 crews in total.

With a number of crews with changes from the previous season, it did take a while for crews to get into their groove, and thus saw limited numbers of crews traveling to the various events around the country, while in previous years the entire boat section would travel to all events. This year, due to various things (injuries/family/work commitments), it was Nationals before we were able to get all 7 crews to the one event.

Strong early form from the open women ("Tumbleweeds") and the U 23 women ("Cicadas") saw them invited to the NZ trials in Whangamata pre-Christmas. Both crews showed good boat speed at the event, but couldn't quite match some of the finer race skills of the two crews who were eventually selected.

Centrals saw good results again from the 3 open women's crews (Tumbleweeds, "OG Mums", and "The other mums"), continued success for the Cicadas and solid racing from our injury ravaged U 19 women.

North Island champs were again well contested and although all crews that attended made finals, we did struggle to get crews on to the podium with a number of 4th places.



With the whole team making it to Nationals, we started to see the results of the hard work start to pay dividends. Mt Maunganui Nationals provided basically flat conditions for the entire event, but our section performed incredibly well and turned up some great results. Thursday began with Masters, and a bronze for our 180's masters men, a gold for our 140's women (OG mums) and gold for the 160's women (Other Mums). All three masters' crews would then move onto compete in the open grade for nationals with both women's crews doing extremely well. Our U 23 men ("Birdbaths") finished with two silver medals in both short and long course. U 23 women (Cicadas) bronze in long course and U 19 women (Lulu's) bronze in the short course. In the open women, the OG Mums made both short and long course finals, and the Other Mums made the long course final.

The Cicadas finished with silver in the NZ surfboat national series (Aggregate points across 4 national events) and the Birdbaths finished with bronze in the national series.

We continue to show good strength in both crew numbers, and representation on the national boat stage. Early indications are looking like a minimum 7 crews again next season, possibly pushing to 8 or 9. Our Bay of Plenty branch, currently masters' men and the Other Mums crew, may be adding a U 19 crew to the mix based out of Tauranga. Interest locally all suggests a growth in numbers down here as well.

Training is already underway for several of our crews who will be attending events in Australia over the next 6-7 months. We have a master's women, masters men, and a U 23 women's crew attending the world surf lifesaving champs on the gold coast in August. We then have the masters' men, and open women (combined OG mums and Other Mums) racing in the George Bass 7-day surfboat marathon on the Sapphire Coast south of Sydney over the new year period. This is a 190km race contested over 7 days.

Plenty to look forward to for boaties in the coming season.

The season kicked off with a number of development days, followed by a development weekend held at Riversdale Beach. A huge amount of experience was gained during this weekend with some challenging conditions. A number of Paekākāriki candidates were signed off as IRB drivers and we look forward to the coming season and getting a few more signed off.

A massive congratulations to all who gained their qualifications. We had 3 new IRB drivers, 6 new crew persons and 10 refreshed IRB drivers.

The competition calendar began with the Tangi Cup long haul race in which we had 2 crews racing - Hugo, Mac and Robbie, and Ben, Rhys and Riley. A big congratulations to Ben, Rhys and Riley for taking home first place.

Next was North Island Champs at Waipu Cove, again we had 2 crews racing - Dwight and Tyler, and Ben and Rhys. Both crews made several finals but with very challenging competition, no medals were taken home.

Looking towards next season, IRB training starts in a couple of weeks. The IRB instructing team will continue to run these with some new IRB instructors looking to join the team too. This is exciting and shows development and work we have been putting into our drivers. We look forward to growing our IRB team and hope to continue to see new faces in the Paekākāriki tent at IRB competitions this season.

Junior Surf

Much like the build project for the new club house, Paekākāriki nippers have spent the last season laying a strong foundation for the club. A large focus for the year has been in building interest in our younger age groups, and it was exciting to start this season with Little Nippers, the club's first U7 age groups. The Little Nippers programme provided beach sessions for kids aged 4-6, with a focus on growing confidence and learning water safety skills. It has been a demonstration of the value that comes from the club community, with Amy Garton and Jordan McDowell leading the programme with other parents and lifeguards in the club. This has given an opportunity for lifeguards with younger children to remain engaged with the club, and to pass on their passion at an early age. It was an absolute joy to have the Little Nippers on the beach each week, the only thing bigger than their (slightly) oversized rashies being their smiles. We can't wait to have them back next season.

We also continue to see our numbers stay strong especially across the younger age groups. In total we had 124 financial members registered for Nippers this season, and a further 19 for Little Nippers. Despite the lack of facilities, we have had well over 70 kids on the beach some Sundays. This increase seems in part due to the positive publicity being generated by the clubhouse project and the excellent club communications provided by Elyse Robêrt. It is also a credit to the quality and culture of the junior surf programme. This year we had a large group of coaches, ranging from very experienced former athletes and lifeguards to parents wanting to be more involved. This included putting a number of new coaches through the SLSNZ Introduction to Coaching Junior Surf course and seeing a few of our parents refresh their lifeguard awards after a long break. For some, this meant tracking down a long-ago stored away Bronze award certificate, when SLSNZ record keeping wasn't quite up to date.

With all this support, we were able to have dedicated age group leaders on the beach. This has allowed coaches to engage with the materials provided for each age group within the revised SLSNZ Junior Surf programme. With even more interest expressed through the season, and support and mentoring coming from senior athletes and coaches, the nippers programme is well set up to move into the 2024/25 season. It is this help that makes the junior surf programme possible, so as always, a massive thank you to:

- Beach and board coaches – Elouise, Ariki, Leigh, Hannah, Geoff, Darrel, Rebecca, Vicki, Amy, Jordan and Dylan.
- Our pool coaches, Marco, Neville, Lisa, Jenny and Stevie

- All the parent helpers for both Little Nippers and Nippers.
- All the lifeguards who help patrol the beach sessions and inspire the nippers to become lifeguards themselves.

The U8-U10 age groups have maintained large numbers from last season. It has been great to see a close cohort of kids come through these age groups this year, and to see them support and push each other as they begin to develop their board and surf swimming skills. With the number of nippers within the younger age groups, we were very grateful to receive a generous grant for new boogie boards from the Paekākāriki Community Board early in the season. Our youngest nippers are also a very competitive cohort, and it will be exciting to watch them over the coming seasons. Numbers within the U12-U14 age groups remained small, but the athletes within these age

groups all showed a consistently high level of commitment. Board training started in October with the whole trailer in use, and these numbers stayed high throughout the entire season.

Our Thursday night pool sessions were also a huge success this season. Nippers were active in both the programme and lap pool at Coastlands Aquatic Centre. The success of the programme pool and entry level lap pool levels have been particularly notable this year and has been the source of a lot of positive feedback from parents. By the end of the season, we had 45 nippers successfully renew or achieve their 200m badges.



Carnivals

Carnivals once again got off to a rocky start with the cancellation of Worser Bay due to heavy rainfall. Following this early setback we had very high numbers turn out for the Titahi Bay Carnival, with 52 nippers representing the club. Carnivals were also held at, Riversdale, and Lyall Bay. We had an average of 40 entries in the local Carnivals this season (up from 31 last year). Paekākāriki had a great turn out for the Capital Coast and Central region champs, achieving medals in events across both, and 11 overall age group winners at Capital Coast champs.

We had 60 nippers competing, along with a group of Little Nippers getting their first taste of competing. We were very lucky to have Jenny from Siaso Photography capturing the day. Lots of club families enjoyed the end of the season while enjoying food from the Foxton Fish and Chippery.

Oceans

We had a crew of 16 athletes travel to the Mount for Oceans. Oceans was again a massive highlight of the season. New Building funding

A great team who has some fabulous ideas and has been working very hard on various projects - they deserve a huge vote of thanks. Their support and mahi has been immensely appreciated!



Our aim at the last year's Annual Report was to have a minimum of \$3.2m by July last year in order to get things started by December. Due to a few hold-ups at Council around our Building Consent, this was a bit stymied, but thankfully the funding target was reached, and since last year we have managed to secure enough funding to confidently commit to stage 1 of the new building (closed in).

Special thanks to Matt for working so hard on the submission to SLSNZ which secured us \$1.4m to be paid out this July. That really got us over the hump to begin the project.

Emma and I are working together on finding more funders and I'm really grateful for the huge amount of time and energy Emma puts into this. We were very grateful that Pelorus Trust donated a further \$60,000 this year, with Pub Charity coming on board with \$40,000. A very generous Family Trust "the Phillip Verry Charitable Trust" also donated \$20,000 and thanks to that connection we have also secured some great discounts for timber through Red Stag. A number of companies have been put in touch with Homestead who are working with them to try to secure donated materials for the building, including Prysmian and Plumbing World.

Elite Arbiculture donated their mulching servicing during the clearing of the new building section and we continue to work with local companies who are offering in-kind help.

Other smaller amounts were raised through two fundraising events – the Casino Evening lead by the fundraising team and the Comedy Evening lead by the boaties. Thanks to both groups for all their hard work.

We have more fundraising events coming up this year, the largest of which will be our Legacy Wall which is soon to be launched and is being sponsored by the wonderful team at Wellington Splashbacks. A massive thanks must go to this team led by Karen, Emma and Sarah who have done a great job but know there is still a lot more work to go.

On the planning side we have been fortunate to have many skilled people working to get all of the boxes ticked for the construction to start. Hamish from HWA architecture has put in a massive effort to complete the consenting issues and get the drawing ready for construction. Nick Taylor from Cuttriss has been instrumental in navigating the pathway through the consents process. Both are still highly involved in the construction phase.

In March we had a ground breaking ceremony lead by Ngati Haumia and Ngati Toa to bless the site for construction. The turnout was great and we had members past and present mixed with the community to see Joost Brink and Lexie Garton turn the first sod, a very memorable occasion.



We have now handed the site over to Homestead Construction and Mills Albert Limited to begin the work on the project. It is fantastic to finally have the project underway. The contractors will be onsite for the next 12 months completing the build.

Finally, I must thank the management committee and various sub-committees who have spent many hours discussing reports, contracts, attending meetings and keeping the project alive. This time next year I hope we are talking about the official opening and how we will use the club in the future.



The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on the Performance Report.

Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner we have no relationship with, or interests in, Paekakariki Surf Lifeguards Incorporated.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the Performance Report, including the resources and commitments of Paekakariki Surf Lifeguards Incorporated as at 30 April 2024 and its entity information, service performance and receipts and payments for the year then ended do not comply with the requirements of the Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Cash (Not-For-Profit) reporting standard.
